## PRADAXA IS AN IMPORTANT NEW MEDICINE

octors often prescribe "blood thinners" to prevent clots. There are two classes of blood thinners. The first makes platelets less "sticky." The best known is aspirin. A daily low dose or "baby" aspirin is sufficient. The second class interferes with the clotting proteins in our blood. Heparin, which requires injection, is one of the best known. Many patients who first take heparin are converted to an oral medicine called Coumadin (aka Warfarin). Patients who take Coumadin must have their blood checked on a regular basis. Some patients have to frequently adjust their dose up or down to make sure they do not clot (too little) or bleed (too much).

Now, after many years of research and many clinical studies, a second oral blood-thinner has been approved by the FDA. It is called Pradaxa (aka Dabigatran). It does not require blood testing in most patients. The reason is that the blood level of Pradaxa is not affected by foods and other drugs in the same way as Coumadin. For the same reason, Pradaxa is safer with less risk of bleeding. The one down side to the medicine is cost. So make sure your drug plan covers it before switching.
