

WHY HEMOGLOBIN A1C IS AN IMPORTANT TEST FOR EVERYONE, ESPECIALLY OVERWEIGHT INDIVIDUALS

very time you eat a meal or snack, or drink a beverage, the level of glucose ("sugar") in your blood rises.
Your pancreas secretes insulin so the glucose can be quickly stored. In diabetic and overweight individuals at risk for developing diabetes, the amount of insulin secreted by the pancreas is too low. This can lead to an excessive rise in blood glucose. Measuring blood glucose is useful, but highly variable.

Now there is a convenient test that tells you and your doctor if your blood sugar has been consistently elevated. The test, known as "Hemoglobin A1c," is now recommended by the American Diabetes Association to identify diabetes at an early stage. This is important so that interventions such as education, exercise, and diet can be used to prevent the need for insulin therapy.
